Newsletters

Organizing Classes

Student placement in classes is based upon decisions made by teachers and administrators, taking into account the needs of the child and parent concerns. All staff take the job of student placements very seriously. Teachers and administrators meet as a group (last year's teachers, next year's teacher, Learning Assistance teacher, counsellor) and spend literally hours working to create classes based on the individual needs of children. Ability, workable instructional groups, exposure to a variety of teaching styles, social groups, and additional pertinent information from parents or from any other services involved with the child are all taken into consideration. We do our best to get it right for all our students. If you have a concern please do not hesitate to connect with me for a discussion around these decisions. Remember that, as always, we will have combined classes. As children move through the elementary grades, they will probably be in a combined class many times. The placement of students in combined classes is often a concern for parents. However, the research that has been completed indicates that children do just as well in these classes as they do in a "straight" grade class. The teacher's knowledge of the curriculum and their skills help all children be successful. All this being said I will tell you that with the new class organization guidelines it has been a challenge putting our groupings together this year. We needed to take into account smaller regulated class sizes as well as individual student make-up.

PROFILE OF A SUCCESSFUL STUDENT

A successful student is not necessarily one who gets good marks but one who is working to potential.

A successful student will demonstrate the following characteristics:

- attends regularly
- arrives punctually to school and classes
- has complete notebooks and all necessary supplies for class work and homework
- has established a homework routine
- is healthy, ready and able to work – well nourished and well rested
- is attentive in the classroom
- participates in classroom discussions and activities
- works in an organized and efficient manner in the classroom
- completes work missed when absent
- requests and budgets time for extra help when needed
- gets involved in school activities which encourages a sense of belonging and recognition
- has realistic self-expectations and acceptance of capabilities and limitations
- begins to take responsibility for own work, e.g. balancing work and play time, using planners
- gets support from family
- **gets encouragement from friends.**

If your children will be absent:

If you have never signed on before and do not know your password, or you have already been on the system and just forgot your password, you can ask the system to email you the password. Passwords are sent to the parent email addresses defined on the child's student record. To have the password emailed to you, click on the "Forgot My Password" link next to the Password box.

Help Us Keep Students SAFE

1. Supervision of students before & after school

Parents are reminded that supervision of students on the playground begins at 8:30 a.m. and therefore children should not arrive at school prior to that time. After school, students can wait safely supervised until 3:15 in the Primary undercover area while drivers take the time to park legally and off the recommended walking routes. Parents should review with their children what to do if they are delayed so children know to come to the office to check with Mrs. Adam or ask to use the phone.

All students should have left the school property by 3:30 p.m. unless involved in a supervised activity.

2. Visitor Sign-in

Parents, guardians and all other visitors are asked to enter the school using the main entrance and to check in at the office. Please do not proceed directly to a classroom. All visitors are asked to sign-in and wear a "visitor" identification badge while in the school. This is for the safety of our students, staff, and visitors and identifies our visitors as belonging to our school community. It is important that students, parents and staff feel safe in our building, and that the school is not readily accessible to strangers. Aside from the daily security of our building, we are required to account for each and every child and adult who is in our school during a fire drill, emergency preparation drill, earthquake drill and lockdowns. Your cooperation with this matter is greatly appreciated.

Pedestrian Safety

Walking to school is a great way for students to stay healthy, learn to navigate their neighbourhood safely and meet new friends. It also reduces traffic in school zones which increases road safety for walkers and cyclists approaching the school.

Parents and children must be familiar with traffic safety rules. For children, simply speaking about traffic safety does not lead to safer behaviours. Walking with children and negotiating neighbourhood streets with them, while explaining how to make safe choices provides an experience and opportunity to develop traffic safety awareness. This is an ideal way for young children to practice pedestrian safe skills. Parents and caregivers can teach children these skills and create opportunities for them to demonstrate that they understand and know how to walk safely. Note: It is crucial for parents to model safe pedestrian behaviours. Children will do what you do, so always ensure you make safe choices.

For children, the most obvious journeys for learning to be a safe pedestrian are the ones made to and from school each day. Many parents for a variety of reasons, choose to drive their children to school. Unfortunately, this denies children the experience of learning to cross roads safely. It also creates danger for other children, who are walking and cycling in the neighbourhood.

For parents who must drive, they might consider parking safely away from the school site to walk the last few blocks to school with their children.

Reminders

- **Please do not park or drop off your children in the front parking lot area of the school. This is designated for daycare and emergency vehicles only. The back parking lot is designated for staff only.**
- **Remember to follow the safe routes to school map (posted in our front window and a copy is being sent home shortly with your youngest/only child). Braid is a walking to school street only (no drivers or parking).**

Medical Info.

If your child has a serious medical condition or requires school staff to give him/her medication that we have not been informed of, please contact the school office to update our existing records or to provide us with new information.

Fun Lunch

Our first Fun Lunch date is set for Friday, September 28. Your PAC Fun Lunch committee is excited to bring Fun Lunches back again this year. Orders are submitted on line and your PAC will be sending an email out soon to sign up for Fun Lunch.

Pack-it Back Lunches

We are trying very hard to promote Zero Waste at Beach Grove and in the Delta School District. As a reminder our classrooms no longer have garbage cans but recycling bins out in each of our hallways. We are encouraging our students to use recyclable containers and to 'pack back' those containers or any garbage or leftovers from recess and lunch.

We as a district are strongly encouraging litter less lunches. By packing lunches in re-usable containers and not including items that have disposal packaging we can have a very positive impact on the environment. If an item is not re-usable then it should at least be recyclable.

Lets make the lunch box popular again! If we start teaching our people now then a mend set of recycling will be entrenched for them into their later lives.
