Kindergarten Registration

Registration for next year's Kindergarten classes will take place on Tuesday, February 12 between 9:00 and noon. Parents are asked to bring with them proof of residency (rental or purchase agreement or current property tax assessment), immunization records, and an original birth certificate or passport (parents as well). Also, please remember to bring Doctor's name, phone number, and Care Card Number as well as Emergency Contact Information for your child. At this point, it is not certain how many K classes we will have for the 2019/2020 school year. For this reason, parents are reminded to come to the school on, or as soon after, February 12 as possible. Registrations are not accepted before this date.

Non-catchment

School Choice legislation enables parents to apply to any Delta school. However, there are procedures in place that protect spaces for catchment area students in their home school. If you know of any families who would like their child(ren) to attend Beach Grove next year but do not live in our catchment area, please pass this information on to them.

This is for all grades 1-7, these forms are to be submitted to the requested school. **For kindergarten students these forms are to be given to the catchment area school.**

Parent Reminders

Parents in the building

During the fall terms, we expect an increase in the number of parents entering the building first thing in the morning to speak with teachers, help young children with coats and boots, and generally hanging around outside of classrooms. While we understand your desire to make sure your child is organized we need to acknowledge that, as we move into term 2, children need to be self sufficient in getting organized and ready to start their day. Students are able to be ready on their own after recess and lunch and, if needed, teachers are there to help out. To this end, it would be appreciated if parents would leave their children at the door of the school to enter with classmates. This will allow teachers to be able to move quickly into morning routines and also help us ensure our hallways are safe. Obviously if there are immediate concerns that need to be dealt with then we understand; however, this should be a rare occurrence. If you need to be in the building, please come in the front door and sign in at the office. Please feel free to contact your child's teacher via email or phone or stop by the office and speak with myself for anything we might be able to help out with. Thank you for your understanding.

Students and cell phones:

We recognize that parents are wanting to be able to contact their child when a concern arises. As a result students are bringing cell phones to school in ever growing numbers. If your children are bringing cell phones to school please remind them that once at school the devices should be powered down and stored in the bottom of their backpacks in the coat area. Students should not be using cell phones at school unless for a specific purpose as outlined by their classroom teachers.

School Ground Supervision:

Just a reminder that while children are at school it is the expectation that they are under school staff supervision. Supervision on the grounds begins at 8:30 am prior to the start of school and ends at 3:15 at the end of the school day. If you are dropping your child(ren) off in the morning please remind them that they must be on the school grounds while waiting for the bell to ring in the morning. It is far too difficult for our school staff to monitor the park areas around the school. Your support in helping keep all our students safe is appreciated.

Finally, if you need to collect your child during the school day please remember to, if possible, let the classroom teacher know in advance. When picking up your child always come to the office to have your child called out of class.

Profile of a successful student

- has complete notebooks and all necessary supplies for class work and homework

- works in an organized and efficient manner in the classroom
- completes work missed when absent
- requests and budgets time for extra help when needed

- has realistic self-expectations and acceptance of capabilities and limitations
